# DOG TREAT CONTAINERS

To make a dog treat container, you will need an empty, plastic jar (thoroughly clean a recycled jar with a lid) and paint that will adhere to plastic and is washable; removable stickers or a paper cover that can be removed to wash the jar in between refilling with treats.

To make a paper label, measure the circumference of the jar and add an extra inch. Measure the height of the section you want to cover on the jar, and then cut your paper to those measurements. Decorate with drawings, words, pictures cut out of magazines (trim and attach with glue), or stickers. Remember that the extra inch will be hidden when the label is applied. Once you have finished decorating, position the label where you want it on the jar and tape with removable tape on one end. Wrap the label around the jar and attach the other end with removable tape.

Removable stickers can be placed directly on the clean, dry jar. Paints can be applied and should be thoroughly dried before using. Fill your new jar with treats for your favorite pup!
